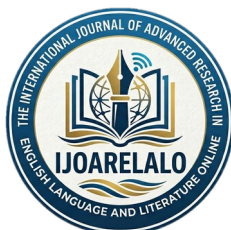


Future Trends in English Language Teaching and Learning: Virtual Learning, AI-Based Education, Innovative Teaching Practices and Emerging Educational Practices
